### UTAR 20th Anniversary Logo

The colours used in the logo are derived from the UTAR logo colours of blue, red and yellow which indicate the Malaysian identity of the university. Blue symbolises commitment and the future. Yellow symbolises intellect and quality. Red symbolises strength and passion. The blue illustration of the logo replicates the Chinese characters "二十" (Twenty), with one of the strokes depicting the rising wings of the Phoenix. The UTAR logo at the base symbolises the foundation of strength and resilience while the rising wings of the Phoenix symbolises the dissemination of knowledge and the advancing growth of the university. The logo embodies UTAR's 20 years of inspiring educational excellence while forging ahead with continuous commitment to quality education, research and innovation, contribution to the community and sustainable growth.



### 20 Years of Educational Excellence

UTAR was established through the generosity and donations from the public community, donors, philanthropists, and organisations. As a university by the people for the people, in return, UTAR provides affordable quality education and financial assistance to help the less privileged students attain tertiary education. While helping to meet the educational objectives of the nation and providing higher educational opportunities to youths, UTAR also contribute to the capital and human resource needs for growth and development of the nation and the region.

UTAR has experienced remarkable growth since its establishment in 2002 as a not-for-profit private university owned by the UTAR Education Foundation. From an initial enrolment of 411 students, UTAR has since expanded very quickly with two campuses, an enrolment of more than 21,000 students, more than 77,000 alumni, and established the new private not-for-profit UTAR Hospital in Kampar Campus offering affordable quality medical services.

UTAR has become reputable as a university of research and teaching excellence offering more than 130 academic programmes, qualified and dedicated faculty, highly employable graduates, and extensive partnerships of over 500 partners from 30 economies. The university continues to advocate innovation, entrepreneurship, sustainability and best practices through its faculties and 35 Research Centres involved in diverse R&D projects.

With more than 100 external examiners from 19 economies, and more than 140 industry advisors, the university upholds relevant curriculum and standards for quality learning, and respectful educational practices while promoting diversity in teaching and learning.

UTAR is committed to advancing the university as a learning institution that advocates innovations and entrepreneurship to meet the changing societal and industry needs, developing a nurturing environment essential for growth, improvements and change, promoting an understanding of global perspectives, and upholding ethical standards and practices.



I look forward to reading more successful stories of UTAR and sharing them with you in the years ahead. May UTAR continue to excel to be a global premier University.







### YABhg Tun Dr Ling Liong Sik A Visionary and Magnanimous Leader

About 21 years ago, a conversation between two great men on a flight brought about the birth of a university. One was the nation's fourth Prime Minister and the other was the Minister of Transport at that time. That conversation sparked the realization of a 32-year-old dream of the Minister of Transport and his team of supporters. On 5 July 2001, that university was finally born and given a name, when approval was given by the then Minister of Education to establish Universiti Tunku Abdul Rahman (UTAR).

That Minister of Transport and the founder of UTAR is none other than the magnanimous Tun Dr Ling Liong Sik. Through his perseverance and passion for education, UTAR became a dream come true for the people. While he knew that UTAR would change the landscape of private education, he did not know then that after 20 years, more than 77,000 students would eventually benefit from the educational journey at UTAR and graduate into a life of betterment for their families and increased career opportunities for themselves. He did not realise then that UTAR would eventually provide employment to more than 2000 staff in the university in 2022. What is more amazing is that UTAR would boost the socio-economic growth of the towns where the university is located, provide business opportunities for local vendors, and contribute to the growth of the community. That dream transformed the lives and livelihood of thousands of students and their families by providing them the opportunity for an affordable quality university education.

As the Father of UTAR who led and played a pivotal role in the establishment of UTAR, Tun Dr Ling has certainly taken care of the UTAR family. Through his magnetic leadership and his dedication, he engaged the assistance of donors, philanthropists, friends, peers, organisations, corporations and the simple people on the streets to donate and raise funds to build UTAR. This was no simple feat, but one that was so amazing and touching, that millions of ringgit were raised through the generosity of the people in support of UTAR. This tremendous financial commitment from the people is truly reflective of the trust given to him by the donors and those who truly believe in him and share his vision for UTAR.

Over the years, Tun Dr Ling remained focused on leading and building UTAR in his capacity as the first Council Chairman of UTAR, and subsequently as the first Chancellor of UTAR until today.

Tun Dr Ling received his education in some of the finest educational institutions in the country and region - King Edward VII Institute in Taiping, the Federal Military College in Port Dickson, and subsequently, the University of Malaya in Singapore where he graduated with a medical degree in 1966.









After graduation, Tun Dr Ling served at the Penang General Hospital where he met his wife, Toh Puan Ena Ling. After marriage, he applied to serve in the rural areas and was posted to the Butterworth District Hospital as a resident doctor. He later set up a private medical clinic in Butterworth.

Even as a young man, Tun Dr Ling displayed great foresight, intelligence and leadership. He said that, "Being a doctor is no doubt a very noble calling. However, as a doctor, I can only help one patient at a time. In politics, every decision one makes can affect and benefit thousands and thousands of people."

This noble thought motivated Tun Dr Ling to leave his medical practice to go into politics in 1969. He joined MCA and later, in the 1974 general elections, he was elected as the Member of Parliament (MP) for the Mata Kuching Constituency. In 1976, he was appointed as the Parliamentary Secretary to the Ministry of the Federal Territory and Local Government. He was re-elected as MP in the 1978 and 1982 general elections. In 1982, he was appointed as the Deputy Finance Minister. In the 1985 party election, Tun Dr Ling became the MCA Deputy President. In 1986, he was elected as the sixth President of the MCA. In that same year, he was appointed the Minister of Transport in Malaysia, a post which he helmed for 17 years until he retired in 2003. His capable leadership during his tenure as the Minister, made many positive changes for the country and enhanced the lives of many people

who remember him till today.

Tun Dr Ling's passion to provide quality education to all had driven him to continue his efforts from the last millennium into this millennium. His time and contribution to UTAR was enormous, with unceasing hard work that eventually led UTAR into its next great achievement - the establishment of UTAR Hospital which began construction in 2018. Tun Dr Ling continued until today to be involved in seeking support from donors, his contemporaries, friends and the community to source funds to help build UTAR Hospital.

For his indomitable dedication to education and his contribution to the development of UTAR, the press also called Tun Dr Ling the Father of UTAR Development – an endearing term that reflected his contributions to the university.

It is an undisputable fact that UTAR would not have been what it is today without Tun Dr Ling's unfading passion, unwavering determination and undying perseverance. His unceasing efforts in growing UTAR have brought about the betterment of thousands of students and thousands of graduates, who, in turn, bring betterment to their families and the community.

Tun Dr Ling Liong Sik is truly a giant among men whose burning desire to serve the people will continue to inspire and live on in the hearts of many.



### **UTAR Kampar Campus**

UTAR's main campus in Kampar was built on a 1300-acre piece of land donated by the Perak State Government. It is located in the growing township of Bandar Barat Kampar in Perak. Strategically located off the North-South highway, Kampar Campus is 190 km from Kuala Lumpur which is slightly over two hours away from the city by car. The Campus welcomed its first intake of students in May 2007.

Known as a former tin mining town, Kampar is a district within Perak's Kinta Valley, which is historically rich with tin reserves. Today, Kampar is a bustling education hub following the establishment of the Kampar Campus.

Flanked by picturesque mountains, dotted with scenic lakes and located within a growing township, Kampar Campus offers a conducive and serene learning environment. This Campus features modern educational facilities and provides students with access to some of the latest learning technologies and research innovations. In addition, the Campus has facilities for sports such as football, basketball, volleyball, badminton, table tennis and a gymnasium. ### **UTAR Sungai Long Campus**

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

### **UTAR Bird Sanctuary**

Surrounded by 25 scenic lakes, UTAR Kampar Campus is an avifauna hotspot that attracts scores of nature lovers and bird watchers. Interestingly, one of the lakes located at the entrance of the Kampar Campus is a haven for a variety species of migrating birds. Fondly named as the UTAR Bird Sanctuary, one would find a heronry located on an islet in the middle of the lake. The heronry is a location where heron species breed in colony, which itself is an uncommon sight in the country, as special conditions are required to attract the herons to select the location as a heronry. The most important factor is that the birds must feel safe at the location.

Since its establishment in 2002 and over the years, UTAR has transformed into a progressive university and staged its presence as one of the premier private universities in the country. The university has weathered through various challenges including the COVID-19 pandemic, and has remained viable while showing its ability to induce change within its organisation and adapt to the changing socio-economic environment.

UTAR has become increasingly more knowledge-based focusing on getting its staff and students involved in diverse research and development, encouraging entrepreneurship and innovation, introducing globalisation through international exchanges and experiential learning, engaging key industry leaders in its educational activities and curriculum, and introducing immersive learning technology and latest information and communication technologies.

The expedient move to online and hybrid learning during the pandemic was smooth and effective as the university had already commenced the setting up of its online resources years before the pandemic. This was achieved through UTAR WBLE which houses all the online teaching resources, short courses, data and knowledge of the academics which are free for staff and students to access. In addition, the library had already purchased and established major online databases, e-services and e-books prior to and during the pandemic. The consolidation of the efforts by the academics, support staff and students made online teaching and learning a successful implementation to fulfil UTAR's educational objectives

The university has become more responsive to increasing industry expectations and has endeavoured to ensure its graduates remain relevant to the industry to maintain high graduate employability. The acquisition of knowledge is balanced with the development of soft skills and professional ethics that lead to a wholesome quality university education. Data analytics and the leading-edge artificial intelligence have been introduced into the learning curriculum and research for graduates to be future-proof in the face of fast changing technologies and industry business trends.

To fulfil UTAR's clear vision and mission to be a global university of transformative societal impact and excellence in education and research, the university implemented its first 10-year strategic plan for the period 2004 – 2013, and the second strategic plan for the period 2013- 2022. The third 10-year Strategic Plan for the period 2023-2032 has been completed for implementation and will be the beacon that will lead UTAR into the next decade.


UTAR's dynamic physical growth has been reflected in the move to its own campus in Sungai Long in 2015. From rented premises in Petaling Jaya, UTAR eventually has its own building and campus in Bandar Sungai Long. Over the years, many research centres, industry sponsored labs and equipment, collaborative project centres, partner university collaborations including the setting up of the Mary Kuok Library; all reflected the tremendous support from the industry, international partners, donors, philanthropists and the community which added to the growth and expansion of UTAR.

The biggest expansion of the university is the establishment of the not-for-profit UTAR Hospital in its UTAR Kampar Campus. Construction began in 2018 and the T&CM Centre was completed in early 2022. This hospital was built solely from donated funds from the people and this reflects the tremendous support and trust from the community for the university.

The student enrolment grew to more than 21,000 with more than 2,000 dedicated staff helping UTAR achieve its daily operational goals and objectives.

Ultimately, for all the achievements and growth over the years, UTAR received much recognition among the local and international community when it received good recognition from the Malaysian Qualifications Agency and was awarded Self Accreditation Status and 5 Stars in Setara' 2019. The *Times Higher Education* and the QS World Rankings have both continued to place UTAR in its rankings table since 2016, placing UTAR among the top private universities in the country.

UTAR will continue to grow and expand in the future as it spreads its wings to meet the challenges of the next decade.

### **Campus Developments**

### First Huawei University Training Lab



Malaysian Prime Minister's Special Envoy to China Tan Sri Ong Ka Ting officiated the opening of the UTAR-Huawei Networking Lab at UTAR Kampar Campus on 17 October 2012.

The UTAR-Huawei Networking Lab will enable UTAR students to have not only theory classes on the latest knowledge on ICT, but also the hands-on practical experience to acquire the latest ICT skills. The acquisition of theoretical knowledge and practical skills complement and strengthen each other, hence improving the competency of UTAR ICT students so that they are better prepared for the industry.

The UTAR-Huawei Networking Lab is part of the Talent Roadmap 2020 under the Government's Economic Transformation Programme to propel the country to be a high-income economy by 2020. Huawei is collaborating with MDEC in developing ICT professionals to meet the human capital demand of Malaysia, which includes the setting up of Huawei University Training Labs with 10 local universities. UTAR is one of the 10 selected universities and the UTAR-Huawei Networking Lab is the first Huawei University Training Lab to be set up in Malaysia.

### **UTAR Community Counselling Centre**



Driven by the desire to serve the UTAR community and the public, the University's Centre of Applied Pyschology took the initiative to establish the UTAR Community Counselling Centre at UTAR Kampar Campus. The centre was launched by UTAR Council Chairman Tun Dr Ling Liong Sik on 30 October 2013.

The UTAR Community Counselling Centre aimed to creating a friendly, harmonious and psychologically healthy society, discovering and nurturing the unused potential in every individual, instilling positive attitudes and values in the society, helping every individual to live to his or her fullest and searching for meaning in life and finding one's true self

The centre has dedicated volunteers and students trained by professional counsellors. Currently, we have five types of counselling rooms, namely the Group Counselling Room, Sandtray Therapy Room, Individual Counselling Room, Psychology Room and Observation Room.

### Taiwan Resource Centre for Chinese Studies (TRCCS)



In collaboration with the National Central Library, Taiwan, the Taiwan Resource Centre for Chinese Studies (TRCCS) was established at the Universiti Tunku Abdul Rahman Main Library on 29th November 2013. At this official launch, a collaborative agreement was signed between the National Central Library, Taiwan and Universiti Tunku Abdul Rahman at the Main Library in Kampar, Perak. This new resource centre, which is located on the 3rd Floor of the Main Library, houses an impressive collection of books pertaining to Chinese and Taiwan studies.

The National Central Library, Taiwan will continue to donate books to grow the TRCCS. To further share and promote Chinese studies resources, they have also provided access to their digital collections. These resources are certainly beneficial to the scholars, faculty and students of the University.

# GPU EDUCATION CENTER

The Faculty of Information and Communication Technology (FICT) at Universiti Tunku Abdul Rahman (UTAR) has been named a GPU Education Centre by NVIDIA, the world leader in visual computing, based in the United States of America.

GPU Education Centres are recognised institutions that have integrated GPU computing techniques into their mainstream computer programming curriculum. GPU computing leverages the parallel processing capabilities of GPU accelerators and enabling software to deliver dramatic increases in performance for scientific, data analytics, consumer, and enterprise applications. UTAR has been recognized based on its demonstrated commitment to advancing the state of parallel education with GPU technology and the CUDA parallel programming model.

As a GPU Education Centre, UTAR will have access to a number of benefits, including teaching materials, NVIDIA parallel programming experts and resources, NVIDIA GPU hardware, and the CUDA Cloud Training Platform.

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### **Research Project for Perak Chinese Tin Mining Industry**

A research project on the Perak Chinese tin mining industry between the 19th to 20th century was launched on 4 March 2015 at Grand Kampar Hotel, Kampar.

The two-year UTAR Centre for Chinese Studies Research (CCSR) project, titled "Research Project for Perak Chinese Tin Mining Industry (19th - 20th Century)" (19 - 20 世纪霹雳州华人锡矿业研究计划) is supported by the Perak Chinese Mining Association and will connect the dots between Perak's tin mining industry and history of the Chinese immigration to Malaya as well as the development of townships in Malaya between the 19th to 20th century.



### **Relocation to UTAR City Campus in Sungai Long**

Universiti Tunku Abdul Rahman (UTAR) relocated its campuses and offices in Setapak, Kuala Lumpur and Section 13, Petaling Jaya to its own City Campus in Sungai Long in a move to consolidate and strengthen the university's presence and influence in the Klang Valley.

The consolidation of all its Klang Valley campuses to Sungai Long is a move that will enable UTAR to provide an improved learning environment to enhance the learning experience of its students with better library facilities, a more efficient management of resources in the building and with better security in the one-building complex. This will also provide more opportunities for the UTAR community of staff and students to network and participate in the various programmes of the university which will make the campus a vibrant hub of activities.

### Establishment of the first offshore Mencius Institute at the UTAR Kampar Campus



The first Mencius Institute was established in Xuzhou, China in 2008 under the joint initiatives of Jiangsu Normal University (JSNU), China Zoucheng Heritage Tourism Bureau, and Xuzhou Mengshi Clan Friendship Network to promote the study and research of Mencius, his Confucian thoughts, and also Chinese culture. To further promote these overseas, the institute chose UTAR as its first anchor point to establish the first ever offshore Mencius Institute.

The Mencius Institute at UTAR will emphasise on the dissemination and promotion of Chinese culture integrated with educational activities for all, further allowing keen learners to gain deeper insight into Chinese history, geography, humanity and the essence of Chinese culture.

### Official opening of the UTAR Gallery



In conjunction with the 22nd Convocation celebration, Council Chairman Tun Dr Ling Liong Sik and President Ir Prof Academician Dato' Dr Chuah Hean Teik officially opened the UTAR Gallery on 25 March 2016 at UTAR Kampar Campus's Heritage Hall.

With the four sections; namely, 'The Road to Independence', 'Genesis and Development of UTAR', 'Achievements and Contributions', and 'Community Projects and Student Activities', the gallery exhibits the history, memorable moments, achievements, and progress of the university since its establishment in 2002. Through the display of hundreds of valuable photographs, artefacts, and multimedia resources, it brings to its visitors a rich history of accomplishments showcasing diversity and excellence in areas ranging from culture and arts to academia and research, mirroring the rapid development of the university.



### UTAR Chinese news portal "U-Click"

UTAR Journalism in Chinese Media (JCM) students in the Faculty of Creative Industries launched the UTAR Chinese news portal "U-Click" on 29 January 2016 at the Sungai Long Campus.

The U-Click news portal comprises the Campus News, Community News, Feature News, and Lifestyles, and aims to disseminate news among the UTARians, its partners and the surrounding communities in Sungai Long and Mahkota Cheras.

### IP application for Project Milk

On 27 May 2016, the creators of a game named "Project Milk" submitted an application for Intellectual Property (IP) protection at the Department of Consultancy and Commercialisation (DCC) for future commercialisation. This project was supported by UTAR's Centre of Immersive Technology and Creativity (CITC).



### Mobile apps for bus and security management



Ng Kam Sin, Chief Technical Officer of Recogine Technology Sdn Bhd, developed and contributed 2 Apps for free to UTAR. The UTAR Patrol is a security monitoring system which can be used to facilitate the live location tracking of campus security guards whereas the UTAR bus Go facilitates the tracking of the location of UTAR buses at both its Kampar and Sungai Long Campuses.



### Tun Tan Cheng Lock Centre for Social and Policy Studies



As a tribute to one of the country's founding fathers and the first President of the Malaysian Chinese Association (MCA), UTAR launched the Tun Tan Cheng Lock Centre for Social and Policy Studies (TCLC) in its Sungai Long Campus on 28 February 2017.

The centre will focus on the study of the history of Malaysian Chinese, the formation of Malaya and Malaysia, the contribution of Malaysian Chinese in Malaysian political and socio-economic development in the past, present and future, and most importantly the multi-races co-operation since the British Colonial times in Malaysia. Its findings will be disseminated to the public. Through such initiatives, UTAR hopes to promote the idea of moderation, a realistic value that is increasingly important globally. The centre is located at UTAR Sungai Long Campus.

### TalentHub Program

As the official Education Partner of TalentHub Program, UTAR hosted the TalentHub Program for the first time and it was officially launched at the Kampar Campus on 13 April 2017.

The TalentHub Program focused on three main components; namely, Internships, which include introducing industrial training positions, personal development programmes; apprenticeships and leadership programmes; Fresh Graduate Jobs, which introduces jobs ranging from management trainee programmes to corporate vacancies; and finally Corporate Sponsorship for University Projects, which identifies funding partner for universities' and colleges' co-curriculum assignments and social work.

### **New Village projects**

UTAR launched the UTAR New Village E-Commerce Project named Reconnecting Nature: Introducing Kampung Bagan Sungai Janggut on 23 November 2017 at UTAR Sungai Long Campus.

The UTAR New Village E-commerce Project links the new villages to the small and medium-sized enterprises (SMEs) through the adoption of digital marketing and e-commerce with training and guidance from the UTAR students and staff. The opportunities for learning and economic improvements are provided for the villagers with the hope that it will improve the commercial value of their products and expand their product market beyond the villages.

### China-Malaysia Centre for TCM



UTAR and Guangxi University of Chinese Medicine (GXUCM) launched the China-Malaysia Centre for Traditional Chinese Medicine (CMCTCM) on 12 December 2017 at UTAR Sungai Long Campus.

The CMCTCM is an integrative platform combined with medicine, healthcare, education, scientific research, cultural exchange and industry of TCM established by UTAR and GXUCM. With the acceleration of the Belt and Road Initiative, China has gradually strengthened its support for the revitalisation and development of TCM, especially beyond China. Therefore, the setting up of this CMCTCM is indeed one step closer for further collaborations between China and Malaysia.

### **Establishment of Unovate Centre**



Unovate is a combination of the Chinese character '优' and the English word 'innovate'. The new word means 'excellence in innovation'. This is in line with UTAR's new Chinese name '优大'. The business incubator was established on 17 January 2018.

Since its establishment back in 2018, Unovate Centre achieved several milestones. In 2019, the Entrepreneurship Policy was established. It outlines an overview of UTAR Entrepreneurship Ecosystem that applicable to staff, students and alumni. Unovate Centre provides business co-working space, networking opportunities, training, mentorships, and logistics support. Students and graduates are equipped with practical knowledge and experience to initiate their own entrepreneurial projects. To date, there are 11 start-ups in Unovate Centre.

### **UTAR iCGPA and Blockchain Certification System**



With the support from Silverlake, UTAR launched the Key Generation of UTAR integrated Cumulative Grade Point Average (iCGPA) and Blockchain Certification System at Sungai Long Campus on 9 February 2018.

The Blockchain was introduced in UTAR with the aim to set a secure, verifiable, accessible, distributed, immutable and sustainable education database information. The Blockchain is able to store all records, certificates and awards, transfer credits and learning achievement throughout lifetime without any central database. Information stored within the block is more distributed and encrypted, making each block tamper-proof.

### Blockchain technology and QR codes for UTAR certificates



The blockchain technology is not new to UTAR. This technology was integrated into the university and adopted in March 2018 for an enhanced security feature for its degree certificates.

UTAR's Blockchain Certification System is the collaborative effort of UTAR and Silverlake Symmetry and Technology Research Sdn Bhd. This Blockchain Certification System was officially launched on 9 February in the presence of Silverlake Founder and Group Chairman Mr Goh Peng Ooi at UTAR Sungai Long Campus.

### **PRINTcess at Sungai Long Campus**

A project called PRINTcess, an advanced printer service, was initiated by former UTAR students. The official launch of PRINTcess took place at Sungai Long Campus on 26 July 2018.

PRINTcess is the first student project under the Unovate Centre (UC). The project aimed to reduce the burden of students looking for printer shops and the time taken to queue for computers.





### JobStreet Corner

UTAR and JobStreet.com jointly launched the JobStreet Corner at the Main Library, Kampar Campus on 28 June 2018.

UTAR and JobStreet.com's partnership dates back to 2010 following the inking of the inaugural MoU. The MoU was subsequently renewed exploring collaborative research, job placements, recruitments and joint organisation of career fairs and conferences. The JobStreet Corner is also available at Mary KUOK Pick Hoo Library, UTAR Sungai Long Campus.

### Infineon Power Technology Lab

UTAR and Infineon Technologies (Kulim) Sdn Bhd signed a memorandum of agreement (MoA) for Work-Based Learning Education (WBLE) programme on 12 March 2020 at UTAR Kampar Campus.

The MoA signing ceremony marked the launching of Infineon Power Technology Lab at FEGT. The MoA between UTAR and Infineon Technologies (Kulim) Sdn Bhd will see both parties working closely with Infineon Technologies in research collaboration, research training, joint projects, seminars and workshops.



### MCM eCOM Global Venture unveiled E-Commerce Ecosystem in UTAR

UTAR and MCM eCOM Global Venture Sdn Bhd launched the E-Commerce Fulfilment Centre (ECFC) at UTAR Sungai Long Campus on 28 September 2020 with the aim to create a complete e-commerce ecosystem that comprises the full cycle of the buying and selling of goods electronically.

The ECFC will serve as a warehouse and e-commerce delivery centre that provide fulfilment service such as storing merchandise and preparing merchandise to be shipped out to e-commerce merchant. The ECFC also enables students to experience real e-commerce processes from theory to practice and operations by dealing with real products and customers. Aside from that, the centre is also used by UTAR academics for research purpose.



### Agreement with Ditrolic Energy Solution on solar energy project



UTAR and Ditrolic Energy Solution Sdn Bhd signed an agreement on 28 December 2020 at UTAR Sungai Long Campus to deploy a 4.1 MWp on-site rooftop solar system at UTAR Kampar Campus buildings whereby approximately 9,000 pieces of solar modules would be installed to generate enough power for 75 percent of its peak power demand. Over its lifetime, the system will be able to generate about 108,142MWh of clean energy, enabling UTAR to avoid 75,699 tonnes of CO2 emissions.

Apart from that. Ditrolic and UTAR would also collaborate on area of Research and Development by creating solar research systems at the campus to enable researchers and students to acquire and analyse real life data to enable the advancement of solar system design in the tropical region.

### UTAR and MCM eCOM Global Venture Sdn Bhd established second ECFC at Kampar Campus

UTAR and MCM eCOM Global Venture Sdn Bhd (BizPorter) achieved another milestone by exchanging a memorandum of agreement (MoA) for the launching of the second E-Commerce Fulfilment Centre (ECFC) at UTAR Kampar Campus on 31 March 2021.

The E-Commerce Fulfilment Centre (ECFC) is an initiative of UTAR Unovate Centre with great collaborative support and contribution from MCM eCom Global Venture Sdn Bhd (BizPorter). The ECFC aimed to create a complete e-commerce ecosystem that comprises the full cycle of the buying and selling of goods electronically.



### The launch of the Belt and Road Activity Centre

With the objective to enhance public awareness on the Belt and Road Initiative (BRI) as well as to provide a platform for students, researchers and the public to discuss and share ideas on BRI, UTAR organised the inaugural International Forum on the Belt and Road Initiative 2021 on 15 November 2021.

The Belt and Road Initiative Activity Centre aims to provide a facility to run a variety of soft skills programmes, activities and services for UTAR students. It is also to support UTAR students in performing online collaborative learning with students from different institutions. The Centre will serve as a conference facility, book reading sharing corner and handicraft or New Village product selling and display store.



### **Inception Ceremony of Nutrigenetics and Nutrigenomics** Research and Training Unit (N2RTU) in UTAR



The inception ceremony of the Nutrigenetics and Nutrigenomics Research and Training Unit (N2RTU) was held at UTAR Sungai Long Campus on 16 February 2022. The event was held in a hybrid mode with participants across the globe joining simultaneously via Zoom.

N<sup>2</sup>RTU is the first of its kind in Malaysia with a focus on knowledge and technology transfer in the emerging field of nutrigenetics and nutrigenomics via research and training. It was set up under UTAR Centre for Biomedical and Nutrition Research (CBNR), in collaboration with the University of Reading, with the MoH and NSM as associate partners. CBNR received the prestigious British Council Research Environmental Links (BC-REL) grant to implement N<sup>2</sup>RTU in Malaysia as part of the Going Global Partnership initiative by the British Council with the support of MIGHT, the Malaysian partner to the British Council.

The Top Glove Engineering Lab will serve as a lab where students can learn to execute practical applications of technologies, expand their knowledge and skills and prepare them for real-world applications.

Top Glove also has provided an external grant and scholarship amounting to RM78,448 for a project titled "Development of polyethylene film". This support will enable UTAR to produce highly competent researchers and engineers who will bring economic and social improvements to the country through the use of cutting-edge technologies in the field of engineering.

### Launch of Pestech Railway Power Analysis Laboratory



Lee Kong Chian Faculty of Engineering and Science (LKC FES) held the Launch of Pestech Railway Power Analysis Laboratory on 23 May 2022 at Sungai Long Campus.

The new Pestech Railway Power Analysis Lab aims to help UTAR students and staff study the simulation of power systems and railway systems. In particular, the Electrical Transient and Analysis Program (ETAP) software, one of the most advanced software for electrical power systems modelling and simulation, will be used in the teaching of subjects such as Railway Electrification Systems, Advanced Railway Electrifications Systems and Electrical Design and Utilisation.

### Going green with solar energy at UTAR Kampar Campus



In collaboration with Ditrolic Solar, a 4.1 MWp on-site rooftop solar system was deployed at UTAR Kampar Campus buildings whereby installation of approximately 9,000 pieces of solar modules started. UTAR entered into this 20-year rooftop solar Power Purchase Agreement (PPA) with Ditrolic Solar to deploy this on-site rooftop solar system. Under Ditrolic Solar's SunLease programme, UTAR Kampar Campus buildings in Perak will enjoy the clean energy that will be generated without any capital outlay and purchase the energy at a discounted rate from the regular TNB tariff.

This initiative is mooted by UTAR as part of its commitment to contribute to the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) outlined by the United Nations (UN) in support of clean natural energy and working towards carbon neutrality.



### Green Bank Programme advocates recycling



The effort to instil the practice of recycling and reusing is supported with the setting up of the first Green Bank in Kampar Campus. The Green Bank Programme is a result of the collaboration established through a signing of a memorandum of understanding (MoU) on 30 March 2020 between the Faculty of Engineering and Green Technology (FEGT) and Go Green Online Sdn Bhd.

Green Bank Programme aims to promote successful waste segregation culture among UTAR staff and students; engage undergraduate students in waste segregation activities through Recycle Ranger programme, and carry out projects parallel to Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs), outlined by the United Nations.

UTAR academics and staff gathered resources and collaborated with local and international industry and university partners, and SME professionals to conduct insightful and educational webinars and online courses to ensure its staff, students and even the public are kept engaged in mindful and continuous learning to ensure that their time spent at home also incorporates intellectual pursuits, knowledge acquisition and critical thinking in various areas of interests. Accomplished academics, researchers, professionals, analysts, consultants, corporate leaders, entrepreneurs, TCM, health and medical specialists, among many others, unselfishly shared their knowledge and expertise through the webinars and online courses for the benefit of the students and the public community.







### **UTAR e-Learning Environment**



UTAR commenced its online learning resources years ago to complement face-to-face teaching. This e-learning has incorporated elements of student-centered learning which allow UTAR students to participate in the e-learning resources and activities that are aligned with their course learning outcomes.

### Online Teaching and Learning is a Unique Experience



With the Movement Control Order (MCO) being enforced on 18 March 2020, educators and students transitioned into the world of e-learning with great speed, reaping its benefits while ensuring that teaching and learning continue for both staff and students during this interruption to the current semester due to the Covid-19 pandemic. UTAR students and lecturers found out that learning as well as teaching from the comfort of their respective homes via e-learning during the Movement Control Order period was a unique experience.

"E-learning is a great method of teaching and learning especially for part-time students. I am teaching Managerial Economics where most of my students are working. This gives them more flexibility and they can manage their time more efficiently. From my experience in online teaching I can ascertain that e-learning is a good substitute to traditional learning. Students are able to learn more by reviewing video lectures until they understand the lecture", said Dr Abdelhak Senadjki from the UTAR Department of Economics, Faculty of Business and Finance.

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### **Broad Support for the first e-Convocation of UTAR**





This O2O (online to offline) new retailing platform enables students to conduct integrated retailing business online with delivery options for purchasers to do self- collection or use courier services.

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### **UTAR Hospital**



On 16 November 2009, Universiti Tunku Abdul Rahman (UTAR) established the Faculty of Medicine and Health Sciences in UTAR Sungai Long Campus offering the MBBS and bachelor's degree in Chinese Medicine, Nursing and Physiotherapy. The first batch of MBBS, physiotherapy and Nursing students graduated in 2015, and the first batch of Chinese Medicine students graduated in 2016. The Faculty established its Master of Medical Sciences and Doctor of Philosophy (Medical Sciences) in 2011. More than 700 students have graduated from the Faculty and they are highly sought after by hospitals and the industry.

In order for UTAR to continue its focus on adopting best practices to train and graduate doctors of high calibre, the university established UTAR Hospital which started construction in 2018. The Hospital will not only provide affordable quality medical services to the community; but also, provide clinical training for its MBBS, TCM and Health Science students. While the priority will be on training and providing the best patient and medical care for the overall health of the community, the Hospital will also conduct R&D for best practices and advancement in the medical field.

UTAR Hospital will provide medical and health services in both Western Medicine and Traditional and Complementary Medicine including Chinese. Ayurvedic and Traditional Malay Medicine. The initial phase consists of 250 beds for Western Medicine and 100 beds for TCM with an additional phase of 250 beds in the future. There will be facilities for out-patient and in-patient treatment, diagnostics and treatment, medical and non-medical support, research and education, and administrative centres.

The T&CM Centre of the Hospital was launched in 2022 and commenced operations with services in acupuncture, tuina, internal medicine, moxibustion and counselling. The Western Block of the Hospital is expected to be launched in early 2023.

The UTAR Hospital is built solely with funds raised from donors, philanthropists, organisations, corporations, individuals, and the community. It is a not-forprofit Hospital, established for the community and is wholly owned by the UTAR Education Foundation.

Over the last 20 years, UTAR has remained focused on research and development as the way forward to achieve further growth; explore, discover and seek new solutions; and innovate for improvements to gather new knowledge for continuous learning. The vast array of expertise in the university with qualified academics and 35 Research Centres, and the investments in labs and equipment in campus, create the right mix and environment for R&D innovations and initiatives. The UTAR Research Fund supports R&D funding for its academics and students, while external sponsorships, industry research grants and external project funding with collaborative partnerships contribute towards an average of about 200 R&D activities and projects per year in the university. Such R&D collaborations also bring industry knowledge and technology to the university while our academics provide the expertise to conduct surveys, research and propose new solutions.

UTAR has gained recognition as one of the leading research private universities in Malaysia. Research, Development and Commercialisation (RDC) has become one of the key activities in the university. Its R&D Roadmap ensures sustainability, innovative growth and relevance. The Roadmap defines and refines the university's direction and approach to becoming a renowned research university in the region.

In UTAR, the entire RDC process chain is led by the Institute of Postgraduate Studies and Research (IPSR) and the Department of Consultancy and Commercialisation (DCC) with the Unovate Centre as the incubator for start-ups and innovations among student and entrepreneurs.

Over the years, UTAR has received much recognition in the region and made its mark among universities as one of the leading research universities whose staff and students have garnered national and international awards in R&D, had their research papers published in renowned international journals and won competitions for their creative ideas and innovations. UTAR constantly promotes R&D participation among its staff and student as a culture that leads to discovery learning, creative thinking, innovative problem-solving and personal growth. UTAR is indeed proud of the many successes and accolades that reflected the amount of commitment and dedicated efforts among the staff, researchers and students in R&D.

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## **R&D Projects**



Mudballs project in Kampar Lake

UTAR's Faculty of Engineering and Green Technology (FEGT) and the Built Environment Society joined hands in initiating an environmental awareness workshop at Sports Complex, UTAR Kampar Campus on 12 March 2016 to highlight the myriad positive effects that mud balls have on water quality enhancement.

Titled "Water Pollution? Mud Balls are the Solution!", the project saw the active involvement from UTAR students, staff, as well as Kampar residents, and it served as a platform to enrich the participants' knowledge on the purpose of Effective Microorganisms (EM) mud balls, the making process, and the immense benefits to lake rehabilitation EM mud balls bestow.



#### Creation of Mobile Wood Identification System

UTAR's Centre for Computing and Intelligence Systems (CCIS) and Forest Research Institute Malaysia (FRIM) Wood Anatomy Lab created a mobile wood identification system known as MyWood-ID, which was launched at Forest Research Institute Malaysia, Kepong on 2 Feb 2018, in conjunction with the launching of FRIM Inc.

The UTAR and FRIM researchers have been conducting research for more than two years in creating a mobile application which is able to identify different types of Malaysian timbers, and with this cost-effective technology, it will be useful for stakeholders in the timber industry, timber graders, timber inspectors, quality control inspectors, forest department, log checking stations and enforcement officers.



**Brain Computer Interface System** 

A research team from LKC FES led by Prof Dr Goh Sing Yau conducted a research on Brain Computer Interface Systems, and it was funded by ScienceFund and Ministry of Science Technology and Innovation (MOSTI) Malaysia.

The system's aim was to provide communication and control capabilities to people with severe motor disabilities such as those who are completely paralyzed or 'locked-in, and such technology can also be used to control prosthetic devices. An EEG based BCI system that enables a paralyzed subject to use his or her brain signals to communicate with others and to control a motorized wheelchair as well as switch on remote devices, was also developed by the research team.



W.A.T.E.R Project Appreciation Ceremony

UTAR's Faculty of Engineering and Green Technology (FEGT) in collaboration with SPARK Foundation (formerly known as GAB Foundation) Global Environment Centre (GEC), Department of Irrigation and Drainage Kinta, Ipoh City Council, Department of National Unity and Integrated, Department of Environment, and State and District Education Department celebrated 'W.A.T.E.R Project' Appreciation Ceremony at Kinta Riverfront Hotel, Ipoh on 20 October 2018.

The W.A.T.E.R, 'Working Actively through Education and Rehabilitation' Project, spearheaded by SPARK Foundation and GEC, was an educational outreach effort to rehabilitate the three tributaries of Sungai Kinta. The project aimed at developing and expanding the community river monitoring and protection programmes through community ownership and engagement and also to raise public awareness of the Sungai Kinta under the River of Life (RoL) project.





**Keysight Floating Monitor Invention** 

UTAR Lee Kong Chian Faculty of Engineering and Science students won first place in the Smart Water category at the finals of the Keysight IoT Innovation Challenge held in New York, USA from 21 to 22 September 2019 with their invention, the IoT Detachable Waterway Monitoring Device with LoRa and Self-Sustainability.

The inventions can monitor water pollutants in rivers and lakes with readings that can be downloaded through an app by the community to monitor the quality of water using natural energy sources from the sun, wind and water.

The Keysight IoT Innovation Challenge is a design competition that challenges engineering students worldwide to conceptualise low-power sensor networks to tackle issues brought on by today's rapid urbanisation.



AI Smart Glove to enhance Rehabilitation of Physiotherapy Patients

Lee Kong Chian Faculty of Engineering and Science (LKC FES) student, Lim Chu Chen, created a project titled "Development of an AI-driven Wearable Object Recognition Device for Rehabilitation Purposes" which offers a solution to physiotherapy patients by reducing their number of visits to the centres and enabling their progress data to be collected and sent from home.

This invention served as a perfect solution in this covid-19 pandemic period because it reduces the physical contact between the patients and the physicians, and at the same time, the patient can continue with their treatment schedule.

For this project, Lim invented a smart glove that can recognise objects using a supervised machine learning algorithm and is able to track the degree of joint movements and predict the object that the user is holding with a self-learning algorithm.



#### **Establishment of UTAR Biobank**

In 2021, A team of researchers from the Faculty of Medicine and Health Sciences (FMHS) and UTAR Centre for Stem Cell Research (CSCR) established a UTAR Biobank for induced pluripotent stem cells (iPSC) with the aim to support and facilitate iPSC research in Malaysia and abroad, enable effective research development and establish linkages with both the local and international expertise.

The UTAR Biobank for iPSC is located at the FMHS Postgraduate Laboratory of UTAR Sungai Long campus, where the facilities are maintained by well-trained scientific officers and medical laboratory technologists. The Biobank allows systematic storage, maintenance and distribution of all the iPSC lines produced by all the researchers as well as those acquired from the external collaborative parties.



#### New innovative integrated lightweight foam concrete system

A group of UTAR researchers conducted a research project titled "Eco Green Ultra-Lightweight Foam Floating Concrete", to construct and mimic Ecological Treatment Floating Wetlands (EFTWs).

The project comes from the usage of renewable oil palm shell (OPS) as a bio-based lightweight aggregate and recycled solid polyurethane foam (PUF) as a cavity filler, and can also be used to solve the increasingly stringent requirements for environmentally-friendly products imposed by various developed countries.

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#### 1 Student 10 Trees Campaign launch in UTAR Kampar

The '1 Student 10 Trees' campaign was launched at UTAR's Agricultural Park on 30 March 2022 at Kampar Campus, which was presented by the Malaysian Rubber Council (MRC) and UTAR. The trees were planted within the UTAR's Agricultural Park which will be maintained by the university as an arboretum for the future generation.

The campaign was part of the government's 100 Million Trees campaign and it was aimed at cultivating values and ethics of conserving the environment. The campaign also hoped to create more awareness on pertaining issues such as water conservation, flood management, wildlife, biodiversity and pollution by adopting the United Nations' 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development and contribute to the 17 Sustainable Development Goals (SDG) which address economic growth, social inclusion, and environmental protection.



#### International Grant from the **Engineering Information Foundation, USA**

LKC FES Department of Mechatronics and Bio-Medical Engineering Ir Ts Dr Hum Yan Chai and his team secured an international grant worth USD13,682 for their research project, Bridging the gap between engineering students and non-engineering audience by instilling data storytelling skills through training programmes with industrial use cases and professional certification. The grant was awarded by the Engineering Information Foundation (EiF), USA for one year. His co-researchers were Ts Dr Yap Wun She, Dr Kwan Ban Hoe and Dr Tee Yee Kai. This project aimed to to equip engineers with the essential skill of data storytelling to enable them to translate their data, ideas and results into insights using visualisation techniques, tools and presentation.

Dr Ong received a RM20,000 research grant for her proposal, titled Combination and optimization of sorption and photodegradation processes for various dyes removal while research scholar Yeoh Loo Yew also received a RM20,000 research grant for his proposal titled, Protective Roles of Leaves' Anti-oxidative Enzymes in Chloroplastic Electron Transport.

#### Researchers received 2016 MTSF grant



LKC FES researcher Dr Tee Shiau Foon and FSc researcher Dr Tan Ji both received a Year 2016 Malaysia Toray Science Foundation (MTSF) Science & Technology Research Grant at the InterContinental Hotel, Kuala Lumpur on 6 December 2016.

Dr Tee and Dr Tan received the grants that carry RM20,000 and RM25,000 respectively, for their research projects respectively titled "Association between DNA methylation of HTR24 gene and cognitive function in schizophrenia demonstrated using multiplex families" and "Molecular taxonomy of spiny-backed orb-weavers (Araneae; Araneidae) and related genera in Peninsular Malaysia".

LKC FES Prof Dr Chong Kok Keong was awarded the 2017 Science and Technology Award along with a cash prize of RM30,000 while FSc Master of Science student Esther Thou Mun Huieh won the Science and Technology Research grant amounting to RM 30,000. The awards and grants were presented to them at the 24th Malaysia Toray Science Foundation (MTSF) prize presentation ceremony, held at InterContinental Kuala Lumpur on 7 December 2017.

The grant was given to her for her research on 'A Zebrafish Model of the Schizophrenia-Drug Addiction Association.

The researchers received their prize at the 2019 Malaysia Toray Science Foundation (MTSF) 26th Prize Presentation Ceremony which took place at Intercontinental Hotel, Kuala Lumpur on 25 November 2019.

#### LKC FES academics secured CREST R&D grant 2021-2022



A team of academics from LKC FES and FMHS namely Dr Chee Pei Song, Prof Ts Dr Lim Eng Hock, Dr Lee Yong Hong, Ir Danny Ng Wee Kiat, and Prof Dr Ng Teck Han secured the Collaborative Research in Engineering, Science and Technology Centre (CREST) R&D grant worth around RM522,322.94 for their research project titled "Skin - alike and AI - driven Smart Biosensor - antenna for Monitoring ECG Signals. The grant, which will also fund two postgraduate students and research facilities, will bring to light the multidisciplinary research works of integrating antenna and sensing technology into a wearable device with Artificial Intelligence (AI) features.

#### UTAR academic received ICRA grant from EASTS Japan



UTAR LKC FES academic-cum-researcher Assoc Prof Ir Dr Khoo Hooi Ling was selected to be the recipient of the International Cooperative Research Activity (ICRA) Grant. The grant, worth JP¥1,000,000, was allocated to her for two years from 2020 to 2022, and it was awarded for her research topic titled "Shared Space Design and Modeling: Case Studies in Asian Cities". The grant was also funded by the Eastern Asia Society for Transportation Studies (EASTS-Japan) c/o Japan Transport and Tourism Research Institute.

#### Research grant from ASEAN IVO



A team of LKC FES lecturers' research project, titled "Context-Aware Disaster Mitigation using Mobile Edge Computing and Wireless Mesh Network" was selected for ICT Virtual Organization of ASEAN Institutes and NICT (ASEAN IVO) in 2020. The team consisted of Ir Dr Tham Mau Luen, Assoc Prof Ir Dr Chang Yoong Choon, Assoc Prof Ts Dr Ezra Morris Abraham Gnanamuthu, and Dr Lee Ying Loong.

A total of USD80,000 was awarded for the entire research project, with the funding being allocated yearly, with USD40,000 for the first year and another USD40,000 for the following year.

### Research and Development Colloquium





## **UTAR New Village Collaborative Project**



#### **UTAR-NUS New Village Collaborative Project**

National University of Singapore (NUS) students participated in the UTAR New Village Community Project from 2012. This is referred to the University Scholars Programme (USP) in NUS.

The core objectives of this project are to study the social and economic development in the new villages; to collect information of histories (narratives) and cultures in the new villages; to identify and map the community assets and generate the possible social entrepreneurship idea of the new villages.

Both UTAR and NUS students collaborated together in social New Village projects and visited the villages.



**UTAR-KGU New Village Collaborative Project** 

Kwansei Gakuin University (KGU), Japan has been assigning interns to UTAR Department of Soft Skills Competency since 2013, as part of their participation in the UTAR New Village Project. The duration of the internship would be for a period of five months. The duty of the intern is to plan and organise various activities with the primary school students in the new villages.





#### **UTAR-UST New Village Collaborative Project**

University System of Taiwan (UST) together with UTAR students visited and studied the new villages in Temerloh, Mentakab and an aboriginal village in Lanchang from 11 August to 19 August 2015.

These visits gave the students an opportunity to meet various communities in the villages and see how they live together as well as to learn about the villages' infrastructures and socio-economic issues. It also provided students a glimpse of the new village community lifestyles in comparison to their own.

In 2016, the UST team comprising 11 Taiwanese students visited new villages in Kampar's Sungai Siput Selatan. They successfully launched a series of community engagement projects involving primary school children, while also engaging social media as a means to improve the visibility of these aging new villages by introducing them to Malaysians and the world.



#### **UTAR-WMU New Village Collaborative Project**

Wenzhou Medical University (WMU) students visited Sungai Long Campus on 16 July 2018 until 27 July 2018. The visit aimed to provide students the opportunity to learn more about the cultural differences and the customs in Malaysia as well as to gain experience in healthrelated workshops, community services and networking with UTAR students.

Over the two weeks, WMU students experienced various activities such as Kuala Lumpur city tour, aboriginal museum tour, National Elephant Conservation Centre tour, HIV workshop, Beautiful Gate Foundation workshop, New Village community work and attended classes.





#### Collaboration with ECM Libra Foundation (ELF)

In 2014, UTAR collaborated with ECM Libra Foundation (ELF) to sponsor the Tuition Programme (English, IT and Bahasa Melayu subjects) for Primary school students in New Villages.

This joint programme provides education for school children through the process of tutoring in subjects, such as English, Mandarin, and Information Technology.





#### Collaboration with Malaysian Association of Practicing Opticians (MAPO)

In 2016, UTAR collaborated with the Malaysian Association of Practicing Opticians (MAPO) to help primary school students in rural areas, especially those in need of spectacles.

The project namely, Gift of Eyesight Project received further support from Prof Dato' Dr Chin See Keat, founder of Optopreneur College, who donated 300 frames valued at RM15,000.00 and RM2,000.00 sponsorship from iM4U under the DRe1M Fund.

The "Gift of Eyesight" programme gave away 424 pairs of glasses to students in states including Perak, Selangor, Negeri Sembilan, Kedah, Penang, Melaka and Pahang.



#### Collaboration with New Kopisan New Village

The Kopisan Project started in 2017 through a collaboration with the New Kopisan New Village. Supported by the Kuok Foundation, the Kopisan Project aimed to turn New Kopisan New Village into an ecotourism village in the hope to develop more opportunities for the locals to rebrand Kopisan as a tourist spot to generate extra income for the families in the village.

A total of 2,500 coffee trees contributed by the Foundation were planted in several areas including schools and the empty spaces around the houses in New Kopisan. Moreover, the "Coffeetional" Coffee Tree Plantation 2020 contest was also organised by UTAR and the community of New Kopisan to encourage the involvement of New Kopisan residents in cultivating coffee trees.



## Collaboration with Malaysian Communications and Multimedia Commission (MCMC)

UTAR collaborated with MCMC to conduct a community service programme in SJK (C) Paya Mengkuang, Masjid Tanah, Melaka on 10 November 2018 as a part of UTAR Corporate Social Responsibility initiative. The community service programme involved a 3D Innovation Competition for the primary school students. It aimed to promote STEM education among students and encourage students' interest in STEM-related fields.

A total of 70 students from SJK (C) Paya Mengkuang were introduced to the 3D printing. They were required to come up with a product, used in daily life, by utilising the 3D printer.



### **Efforts During the COVID-19 Pandemic**

In an effort to promote the safety and health of the community during the COVID-19 pandemic, UTAR offered its premises and participated in the National COVID-19 Immunisation Programme.

UTAR Sungai Long Campus, in collaboration with Sungai Long Specialist Hospital, became a COVID-19 vaccination centre from 31 May 2021 to 6 January 2022. Vaccinations totalling 289,537 doses were given to the community through MySejahtera appointments.

UTAR Kampar Campus became the first drive-through vaccination centre in Kampar on 21 June 2021, and moved on to an on-site vaccination centre until 6 January 2022. Vaccinations totalling 383,509 doses were recorded for both campuses during this period. Staff, students and the public volunteered throughout the duration when UTAR was the vaccination centre. This move by the university expedited the vaccinations given to the local and surrounding community.




